

High School Student Scholarship Program 2017/18

We have begun the process of selecting two high school students to join our mission group on a medicalsurgical mission to Dajabon, Dominican Republic as helper-translators. HCMM will join volunteers from other locations to provide surgeries and medical clinics to under-served people in Dajabon, near Haiti. So we will be serving both Spanish and Kreyol speakers. HCMM covers the mission fee and transportation costs for scholarship students, which comes to around \$2,500. Families are responsible for the student's passport and providing spending money for the trip.

- Requirements:
 - Permanent resident of Hancock County
 - Junior or senior attending high school in Hancock County
 - At least two years of Spanish
 - Nice but not necessary: Interest in pursuing a profession in health care
- Application deadline: October 21
- Interviews: Ist or 2nd week of November.

Our sponsoring organization is Medical Ministry International, a non-profit organization that coordinates missions year-round and world-wide. This will be the 5th year working with Dr. Teo Beato and his team in the DR. They run a mission each month, handling all the logistics except flights and passports.
